

# Consistency Pays Off In Primm

## Team AMOIL nabs five podiums in Nevada heat

The bright lights of the NBC television crews are becoming more like a navigational beacon for AMOIL/Kumho Tires Super Team driver Scott Douglas. After finishing third in the first two races of the Championship Off Road Racing (CORR) series in April, Douglas continued his fast pace in the blistering heat of Primm, Nev. in mid-May.

Douglas started the second weekend of CORR racing with the second-fastest qualifying time and led round three for most of the 18-lap affair before getting a bumper full of fellow competitor Johnny Greaves late in the race. The untimely nudge from Greaves caused a broken spindle and an eventual ninth place finish, but it gave Douglas more motivation for Sunday's NBC telecast.

In round four, Douglas clearly had the fastest truck on the track. He qualified the AMOIL Ford F-150 in the top spot as the only truck to break the 55-second mark. Despite the fastest time, Douglas got caught up in the inverted start, meaning he would roll off the green flag from the fourth row. He quickly moved into a long battle for fourth that lasted seven laps before Douglas took over the third spot. Despite a broken steering control valve, Douglas didn't relinquish his podium position and finished third for the third time this season. Heading into the June 7-8 CORR event in Pomona, Douglas sat second overall in the points chase behind Rick Hussman.

"We were fast all weekend," said Douglas following Sunday's race. "The guys really worked hard to keep me up front. Under the extreme heat, AMOIL kept everything running cool. Getting on the podium during this weekend's conditions really makes me proud to be part of the AMOIL Super Team."

AMOIL-sponsored drivers Ricky Johnson and Jeremy McGrath both had excellent weekends in the Pro 2 class. Johnson overcame a spin-out early in Saturday's race and stormed back from 21st for his first win of the year. McGrath picked up two podiums, a second on Saturday and a third on Sunday.

AMOIL is the Exclusive Official Oil of CORR. The next round of racing will be July 26-27 in Chula Vista, Calif., just south of San Diego. The series airs nationally on NBC and the SPEED Channel. Round six from Pomona, Calif. will air on NBC on Sunday, July 6. The Chula Vista races will air live on the SPEED Channel on Saturday, July 26 and live on NBC on Sunday, July 27.

Dealers are encouraged to host AMOIL/CORR parties either at their homes or local businesses during the telecasts of the CORR races. Dealers who host CORR parties will be eligible to win a free trip to the final CORR race of the year December 6-7 in Chula Vista, Calif. # Teague Wins Back to Back

Bob Teague and Paul Whittier took home 14 podium finishes in 15 races in 2007, including nine wins and two world championships. Together, the AMSOIL-sponsored offshore racers have continued their dominance in 2008, earning a pair of early season wins.

The #77 AMSOIL team opened its season at the annual Smokin' the Sound in Biloxi, Miss. The race course consisted of two long straightaways that exited into the Gulf of Mexico. Teague and Whittier mastered the nine-mile course, battling out front with top boats such as Team Peppers and Team Propstop. Although steering problems early in the race caused Team AMSOIL to drop out of the lead, Teague and Whittier were able to hold onto a second place finish, more than a half lap in front of the third place boat.

Next, Team AMSOIL headed to Lake Havasu City, Ariz. for a weekend of racing that featured not one, but two series. Saturday's race was for Pacific Offshore points, while Sunday's race was for the OSS national circuit.

Extremely windy conditions made for a late start on Saturday due to difficulties with setting the buoys on the course. Team AMSOIL looked strong and kept a lead on the fleet with little drama in the race except for having to maneuver around the collision of two V-bottom boats a couple laps in. The team won easily, giving them the early POPRA points lead.

On Sunday, Team AMSOIL competed in a fierce battle right out of the gates with Team Peppers. The Cat Lite teams approached the final turn of the first circuit to find a collision between a pair of Super Cat 850 boats. While Team AMSOIL drove a hard inside line to avoid a stalled boat, Team Peppers pulled wide. Team AMSOIL gained a slight lead on Team Peppers as they both drove down the next straightaway, increasing its lead with each lap before securing its second win of the weekend.

Team AMSOIL will be back in action July 4-6 at the OSS race in Long Beach, Calif.

# Smith Impressive in '99' Victory
